Researcher Consent Statement:

Hello, my name is Manaola Hewett and I'm a graduate student at the University of Washington. I met you back on September 30, 2017 at the 2-hour health and safety pilot clinic at the Fair Work Center. Thank you again for attending the pilot clinic. This phone call is a follow up interview where we hope to better understand your experience at the clinic and to see if the clinic was effective. Your participation is much appreciated and will improve what goes on at the clinic going forward. All questions asked today will go towards my thesis. My thesis is focusing on these worker-oriented health and safety clinics and their effectiveness at helping workers with their concerns at work.

Your participation in this interview is voluntary and you have the freedom to answer or not answer any questions you are asked. Private, identifiable information such as your name, your address, or your health records will not be asked or documented during this interview. The only requested information is demographic data. The demographic information that will be collected is the type of occupation you work in, your ethnicity, your identified gender, age, and the city that you work in.

Before we start the interview, I am asking you for consent to record our conversation. If you agree, I will record our conversation to have an opportunity to listen to it again at a later date in case information written down today is missed. The recorded audio file will not be released and will be destroyed after completing the project. Do I have your permission to record?

Questions

Bolded bullet points are the primary question asked and the white bullet points are possible follow up questions that may get asked depending on how the worker responds.

- How were the concerns that you raised addressed by the experts?
 - How did the answers that the experts gave you help address your concerns?
- What health and safety information from the clinic that was addressed to answering your concerns do you remember?
 - What resources were given to you to take home (if any)?
 - Has it lead to you expressing your thoughts at work and if so, how many of your coworkers have you discussed it with?

- How have you used what you learned at the clinic in your workplace? What did you do at your workplace that can be specifically linked to what you learned and received at the clinic?
 - What empowered you with what was expressed at the clinic to advocate for health and safety at your workplace?
- What type of effect (positive or negative) has this had for you at your workplace?
- What recommendations do you have for improving the clinic itself such as what should be covered during the clinic, the discussion style, or the content provided?
 - Was the clinic what you expected or different from what you were lead to believe?
 - Were your expectations met?
- Have you experienced any additional safety and health issues since you have attended the clinic?
 - What were they?
 - What was the result? Solution?
